

Little River Sportsman's Association Range Rules (2010)

1. Eye and ear protection must be worn at all times anywhere on the range while the range is “hot”. **This includes non-shooters.**
2. No firing is allowed on either the pistol or rifle range when anyone is forward of either firing line (the firing line is defined by the front posts of the shelter). *All weapons must be unloaded and the actions open on the bench and not being handled during this time.* It is the responsibility of the person (or people) going forward of the firing line to ensure that all safety precautions are in place; to do so, the command: “line safe” must be used and acknowledged by all shooters on the line. Upon returning to the firing line the command “line hot” must be used and acknowledged by all shooters on the line. When going down range on the rifle range, place the red flag in the holder so it is visible to the entire firing line.
3. Do not fire at objects on the ground or at targets set low to the ground; doing so could cause a ricochet over the backstop.
4. Center fire rifles are not to be fired on the pistol range or at pistol targets; rifle caliber pistols are not to be fired on the pistol range or at pistol targets. Targets labeled “.22 caliber only” are for .22 caliber rimfire (long rifle, long and short) ammunition. .22 caliber rimfire rifles may be used on the pistol range; however .22 magnum, stinger or other hyper-velocity ammunition can not be used. **All brass must be picked up and placed in the proper container for recycling or disposal.** *Shotguns or pistols using shotgun ammunition are not to be used on the pistol range!*
5. **For safety reasons and for the preservation of the steel targets and supports, no “AP” (armor piercing) rounds of any caliber or 50BMG rounds are to be used anywhere on the range property!**
6. No metal targets are to be shot at a distance of less than 15 yards. The pistol “falling plate” racks are not to be moved!
7. The cowboy/IPSC range is for the use of pistol caliber firearms (.44 magnum or less) and shotguns using #4 lead pellets or less. **NOTE: Under scheduled and controlled Match conditions** other caliber weapons may be used to shoot at paper targets only! After range use return all targets to where they were found. **All brass and shotgun shells must be picked up and placed in the proper container for recycling or disposal.**
8. All shooting must be done at a 90 degree angle to the firing line. Crossfire shooting, shooting without a backstop or not shooting from the firing line is prohibited.
9. Fully automatic weapons (class III) are allowed to be fired on the range; however only one may be in use at any given time. Federal Law requires that the class III license is with the weapon at all times.
10. Alcoholic beverages are not allowed on club property at anytime. Persons under the influence of alcohol are not allowed on club property at anytime.

11. Guests are encouraged; however as a member you are responsible for the conduct of any guests you bring. Each member may bring two shooting guests at one time. Prior permission from the Board and adequate supervision is required for groups of shooters exceeding the two shooters per member rule. All shooting guests will be required to sign a liability waiver agreement (available at the range from the box located on the North side of the pistol range or downloaded from the club web site: <http://lrsa.50megs.com>) prior to shooting.
12. Children are welcome; however children must have direct adult supervision while shooting (under 18 for long guns, under 21 for pistols, active duty military exempt).
13. **Keep our range clean!** Place all trash (drink containers, glass, cans, etc.) in the receptacles provided. **All brass and shotgun shells must be picked up and placed in the proper container for recycling or disposal.** All paper targets must be disposed of properly, all target backers must be replaced in the storage shed. If you move any tables, chairs, etc. put them back where they belong.
14. Skeet throwers must be replaced in the shelter after use.
15. Hunting is not allowed on the range. Fishing is allowed, however shooting takes precedence.
16. Range keys are for members only, they are not to be loaned to anyone for any reason; doing so is grounds for expulsion from the club. Members have the right and responsibility to ask anyone on club property to show their key for identification purposes and if it can not be produced to ask them to leave.

Rule violations should be reported to club officers: David Boyd (244-3161), Lee Ovaert (630-1212) or Don DiStefano (775-2427). All members have the right and responsibility to report misconduct by anyone on the range. A safe and clean range is every club member's responsibility!

A point of courtesy: never touch another person's guns or gear without permission!
